## Carpet & Carpet Padding

For the recycling of post-consumer carpet and padding, the material must meet the following requirements:

- Must be dry, no wet carpet or pad
- Residential or commercial carpet and padding
- No rubber backed carpet or rubber pad
- No carpet tile or other rigid flooring
- Rolled or bagged by single material type (old, new, pad)
- Maximum 6 feet for width of carpet in rolls
- Rolls tied with string or twine (no duct tape)
- Cut out seaming tape as much as possible
- No tack strips, nails, staples or knife blades
- No debris, refuse, rocks or caked mud
- Minimal loose dirt

Note: at these sites you will need to transfer your carpet to the trailers at the site. Transfer assistance is not generally available at collection sites.

## Cell Phones

### Did You Know?

State law requires that all [rechargeable batteries](#) be recycled. It is **ILLEGAL** to put them in your trash.



### Safety Tip

Store [rechargeable batteries](#) in a non-metal container and keep separate from other batteries and any source of ignition.

When storing and/or transporting, tape the receptor ends of the batteries with duct or electrical tape.

## Charcoal

Charcoal is not hazardous unless soaked with lighter fluid.

(Charcoal that is both treated and not treated with lighter fluid is accepted.)

(Charcoal not treated with lighter fluid may be placed in your trash.)

## Cleaners

Many cleaning products contain hazardous or toxic materials that should be properly disposed. ALWAYS read the label for more information and instructions.

Even empty containers may be hazardous because contents can be under pressure.

### Safety Tip

Never mix cleaners containing ammonia with those containing bleach.

Prevent cleaners from going into septic systems, onto the land, or into lakes and streams.

## Construction & Demolition Debris

Construction debris may include: building materials, packaging, rubble, concrete, brick, wood, masonry, glass, rock, metal and plastic building parts. It ***does not*** include asbestos waste.

For larger jobs you may want to use a roll-off container. Look in the *Yellow Pages* under *garbage and rubbish collection* for listings.

## Electronics

Electronic waste is any waste that has a circuit board or a cathode ray tube (CRT). Electronics may contain lead, cadmium, or mercury, which are harmful to human health and the environment. Electronic products containing a cathode ray tube (such as TVs and computer monitors) may not be placed in the garbage.

Electronic waste includes the following products:

- Computers
- Computer Monitors
- Peripherals (keyboards, mice, speakers, etc.)
- Printers
- TVs
- DVD & VCR Players
- Fax Machines

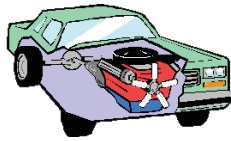
