

Household Medication Disposal



Washington County residents can dispose of their unused and expired medications at year-round drop boxes.

Why are unused medications a problem?

Unused medicines in your home pose a risk for accidental poisoning, theft, and drug abuse. Medication put in the trash or flushed can pollute water, and harm fish and wildlife. You can help. Bring unwanted medications to a drop box for secure storage and disposal by a licensed incinerator.

No Medications from Businesses Accepted

Accepted

Household prescription, over-the-counter, and pet medication.

- » Pills & capsules
- » Blister packs
- » Creams & gels
- » Unused Epipens
- » Inhalers & patches
- » IV bags & vials
- » Liquids/powders & sprays

NOT accepted

- No needles, used Epipens, syringes, lancets or thermometers
- No liquid chemotherapy drugs
- No vaping devices or e-liquids
