Each program must ensure that:

- A. Residents are provided with an orientation to the program abuse prevention plan. This orientation must be within 24 hours of admission or within 72 hours for individuals who would benefit from later orientation.
- B. The license holder’s governing body must review the program abuse prevention plan at least annually.
- C. A copy of the program abuse prevention plan must be posted in a prominent place in the facility and be available, upon request, to mandated reporters, residents, and legal representatives.
- D. The plan must include a statement of measures to be taken to minimize the risk of abuse to the vulnerable adult(s) when the need for additional measure is identified. This includes identifying referrals that are made when the vulnerable adult is susceptible to abuse outside the scope or control of the licensed services.
- E. If the assessment indicates that the vulnerable adult does not need the specific risk reduction measure in addition to those identified in the program abuse prevention plan, the individual abuse prevention plan must document this determination.
- F. In addition to the program abuse prevention plan, an individual abuse prevention plan must be developed for each new resident. A review of the individual abuse prevention plan must be done as part of the review of the program plan. The persons receiving services must participate in the development of the individual abuse prevention plan to the best of their abilities. All abuse prevention plans must be reviewed at least annually by the interdisciplinary team.
