

Support Jurisdictional Transfer of Trunk Highway 96



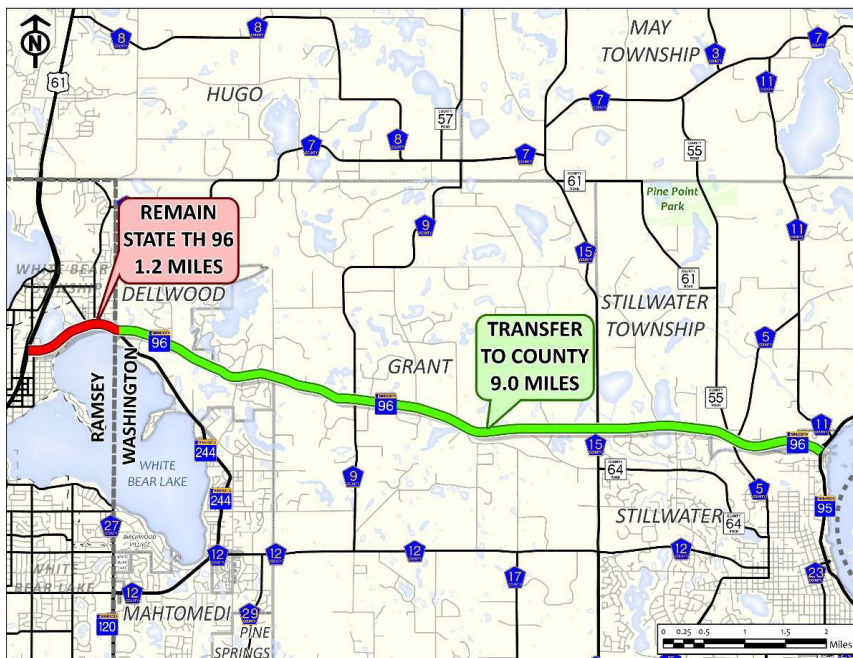
Washington County supports language in the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) Omnibus Bill to facilitate the jurisdictional transfer of Trunk Highway (TH) 96 from the state to the county.

Issue At-A-Glance

- Washington County and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) are in negotiations to transfer jurisdiction of a portion of Trunk Highway (TH) 96 from the state to the county. The portion that would be transferred is between TH 244 and TH 95 – about 9.1 miles. The remaining portion – from TH 244 to US TH 61 would remain a state road on the Trunk Highway system.
- The MnDOT Omnibus bill will contain a provision to change the designated endpoints of TH 96 to reflect this jurisdictional transfer. The bill will contain the following language:

Route No. 96. Beginning at a point on Route No. 244 as herein established at or near Dellwood City, thence extending in a westerly direction to a point on Route No. 1 at or near White Bear Lake.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day after the commissioner of transportation receives a copy of the agreement between the commissioner and the governing body of Washington County to transfer jurisdiction of Legislative Route No. 96 and after the commissioner sends notice to the revisor of statutes electronically or in writing that the conditions required to transfer the route have been satisfied.



Support

The county and MnDOT are in negotiations related to the financial portion of the transfer.
