Household Medication Disposal

Washington County residents can dispose of their unused and expired medications at year-round collection drop boxes.

Why are unused medications a problem?

Unused medicines in your home pose a risk for accidental poisoning, theft, and drug abuse. Medication put in the trash or flushed can pollute water, and harm fish and wildlife. You can help. Bring unwanted medications to a drop box for secure storage and disposal by a licensed incinerator.

No Medications from Businesses Accepted

Accepted at Drop Box

Household prescription, over-the-counter, and pet medication.

- » Pills & capsules
- » Blister packs
- » Creams & gels
- » Unused Epipens
- » Inhalers & patches
- » IV bags & vials
- » Liquids, powders, & sprays

NOT accepted at Drop Box

- No needles, used Epipens, syringes, lancets or thermometers
- No liquid chemotherapy drugs
- No vaping devices or e-liquids

Preparing for drop-off

- Drop-off is anonymous (no ID required)
- No need to cross off your name
- Keep medications in original container
- If you don't have the original container, place in small bag
