Don't Prepare or Serve Food When You are Ill

Food workers who prepare food while experiencing diarrhea and/or vomiting are frequently linked to foodborne illness outbreaks in restaurants and other retail food outlets. As a food manager or worker you have a responsibility to protect yourself and your guests from foodborne illness.



Handwashing in Food Service

Handwashing is the single most effective means of preventing the spread of bacteria and viruses which can cause infections and foodborne illness.

Employees can be a significant source of harmful microorganisms. Proper handwashing can be the most effective action workers can take to control direct and indirect contamination of food, utensils, and equipment.

Who is this training for?

If you do not already have a CFPM from the Minnesota Department of Health, this course will be informative, but will not meet the requirements to apply for your CFPM. This class is for people who have already completed an 8 hour Food Safety class and need a refresher course to renew the Certified Food Protection Manager certificate. Who needs a Certified Food Protection Manager Certification?

Every food service establishment should have a Certified Food Protection Manager. The CFPM is required for most food establishments including full service and Deli/Fast Food/Coffee Shops. The CFPM certification applies to the person, not the establishment. More than one manager or employee can be a CFPM. Unsure if your establishment needs a Certified Food Protection Manager? Contact your inspector at 651-430-6655.

What should I do if I don't have my Certified Food Protection Manager Certificate?
